


2/ School Closure: Instruction for Early Years (Nursery and Reception)

1. Every morning by 9am we will post a letter on the school website. You will find these in the class pages, in the 'class news' section.



2. Select your child's class and you will find daily letters under the heading 'School Closure'





3. Letters will explain two things

- Mrs Wolfrey's & Miss Tadman's 'daily challenges'
- Activities such as learning through play, such as: getting dressed independently, helping with cooking, simple maths around the house, creating Lego models and describing them etc

It is important that parents are part of this process, recording the children's responses, offering feedback on how they managed, observing how independent they are. Parents you can do this by

- > filming your child's response
- > taking a photo of their learning
- uploading their drawing/ writing.

Below are some examples so you know what to do. When feeding back to us it is important to include

- Include speech; write word for word what your child says during the activity
- Add details if appropriate e.g. how they held the pencil, if they used the scissors with one hand etc.
- Explain the level of help they had. There are three levels –
 a) independent
 - b) some support (please detail what support e.g. some words spelt, some letters copied)
 - c) adult assisted (completely led through it.)

Please note, during the school closure; you are responsible for collecting the evidence in your child's learning journey. If this is not completed daily, your child will have an incomplete learning journey at the end of the academic year.




2/ Key Stage 1 (Year 1 and 2) - School Closure: Instruction

1. Every morning by 9am we will post the plan for the day on the school website. You will find these in **class pages** and **'class news'** section.



2. Select your child's class and you will find the day's timetable and instructions letters under the heading **'School Closure'**. This may refer to particular pages in the work packs that have been sent home (e.g. maths and phonics/ spelling), an online game, a video on the website, or it may be a practical task/piece of work to complete in their book.





Please check the class pages of the website regularly for any updates, phonics lessons and other recorded lessons from the teachers.


2/ Key Stage 2 (Years 3, 4, 5 and 6)

Throughput the course of the day, **class** teachers will upload lessons onto Google Classroom. Teacher's will follow the timetable at the start of this letter, this means that all children should be working through maths at the allotted time.

For help logging onto Google Classroom please refer to the attached guide.

Once children have logged into their Google Classroom, there are 2 pages that we would like them to use The **Stream page** and **Classwork page**.

The 'Stream page' is the same as a home page, to get back to the 'Stream page' just click the Stream tab at the top of the screen.




The stream page

- Displays on the left of the screen any upcoming work that is due in.
- Displays any assignments or work that has been uploaded by the class teacher.
- Allows children to share comments with their class teacher, by typing into the box underneath the header that reads 'share something with your class' and selecting post. Anything that is written in here can be seen by the whole class and all the class adults.
- This is only to be used to ask the class teacher questions about your work and not for children to chat to theirs friends. Parents please reiterate this message to your children.

The Classwork page

To access any work uploaded by your class teacher, children need to click on the **'Classwork' tab** at the top of the page.




This page lists all of the different uploads, to make it easier class teaches have created folders which match the daily lessons, this will be labelled as Year 3 Maths, Year 3 Guided Reading, Year 3 Spellings etc.

To access a lesson, children need to click on the heading.

If they wanted to access Monday's maths work they would click on 'Monday 16th March Making the Whole'. Once it has been clicked, the following window will open up and children will be able to view the different uploaded resources for the lesson





You then need to click on 'View assignment' found at the bottom of the window.

When children are in the 'View Assignment' section, it gives the option to turn in work, by clicking the 'Mark as done' button.



Even though work is to be completed in **children's school books**, by clicking the 'Mark as done' button, it allows the class teacher to keep a record of who has logged on and completed their work. \

Support with work

During the allotted lesson times, class teachers and learning support assistants will be available to offer guidance and answer questions through the 'stream' online chat function (see above). To keep this manageable we will only be answering questions regarding the topic that is timetable for that session. You can also contact one of the teachers using the email addresses given at the start of this letter.

Structure of the lesson

For every lesson, slides will be available to support children with their learning. Before children do any work in their books, they will need to work through the lesson slides. Once they are confident they need to write the LC and date into their books and then complete the learning task. They all know the structure!

The learning task will either be included on the slides or attached as a separate PDF. Other supporting resources may also be included for example video tutorial clips. All of this will be clear once you get started.

Marking work

All children will be coming home with a pink and green highlighter. Green is to highlight work that is correct and pink for any misconceptions. Children in Years 5 and 6 are already use to self-marking their work and as a parent if you are unsure of the expectation here, please look back in your child's book.

At the start of every timetabled session, answers from the previous day's learning will be displayed and discussed for the first 15 minutes of the lesson. This will look like: Maths session 9.20am -

9.30am marking work from the previous day using the online chat function, discussing any misconceptions. Then 9.30am – 10.30am the new maths lesson.

Expectations in books

Children need to demonstrate the same high standards of presentation and care that we expect at Meadlands. It is something we have worked very hard to embed by making sure:

- Margins are drawn with a ruler and are 2 -3 squares wide
- Mistakes are not to be scribbled out and instead 1 straight line is drawn through a mistake
- Any drawings regardless of lesson are to be done in pencil and where straight lines are drawn a ruler is to be used.
- Spelling mistakes are to be corrected in purple pen encourage children to use a dictionary to find the correct spelling instead of just having another guess.
- Mistakes in maths need to be corrected in purple pen, we encourage children that if they
 make a mistake to have another go instead of just copying down the correct answer.
- Children will be bringing home pink and green highlighters these are to be used for marking work and only when specified by the class teacher.
- Only children with handwriting pens can use a pen this needs to be a Berol handwriting pen.
- Only pencil is to be used and not coloured pencil to write in any of the books.

Support at home

Even though we are expecting children to work independently, this needs to be overseen by an adult as new concepts and methods will be shared for the children to practice. This needs to be a joint responsibility between the class teacher and adult at home. The lessons we set will be following the national curriculum, therefore, it is vital that all children access all the lesson every day. As the lessons we plan form part of a unit of work and build upon the previous days learning, if they do not complete set work they will find the planned progression a struggle. This could then impact their understanding of new concepts in the summer term.

Contact with your class teacher

Parents please only use the email address given at the start of the document to communicate with your child's class teacher. The online chat function on Google Classroom is to be used by **children only** and this is not a platform for parents to use to communicate.

As part of Key Stage 2's remote learning platform, children need to be able to access their Google Classroom account. Currently we are not planning on using Google Meet or Hangouts as part of our remote learning therefore if children can not access this feature we will not be adding it.

As shared in the Google Classroom guide, the online chat feature that we would encourage children to use as part of their Home Learning is found on the Stream page in Google Classroom.
