Today is: Friday 1st May

Today's tasks are (please see the timetable sent out previously for a recommended structure of the day however this is not a structure you need to follow for nursery but just guidance):

Pencil Control/Fine Motor Skills: Today I would like you to practise writing your name. If you find this tricky you can trace your name. If you find this easy practise writing some other sounds we have learnt, or you can even practise writing some words.

Topic: For our topic today I would like you to have a go at retelling the story of what the ladybird heard. You might use the pictures in the book, or the puppets you have made.
