Today is: Friday 15th May

Today's tasks are (please see the timetable sent out previously for a recommended structure of the day however this is not a structure you need to follow for nursery but just guidance):

Pencil Control/Fine Motor Skills: Today I would like you to practise writing your name. You could do this by making your name out of playdough or finding the sounds in your name and making it from magnetic letters or the sound cards you have made. You can trace your name and then have a go at copying it. There is a sheet at the end of this letter to help with how to practise name writing.


Maths/Literacy: Today I want you to think about positional language: above, under, next to, behind and in front. Play a game of hide and seek but once someone has been found you have to say where they were: "you were hiding behind the sofa" or "you were next to the cupboard". You could even play hide and seek with a teddy! You could play a game with a toy and a box and ask your child to put the toy under/on top/next to the box. Check out the PDF on the website called "Where is worm" to help you explore positions.

Phonics: Today I want you to think about hearing initial sounds in words. Can you hear what sound these words start with: cat, mum, bee, look, fun, hat, elk? Well done. Try the sheet at the end of this letter, if you can hear the initial sound easily, see if you can hear all the sounds in the word.

Topic: In the story Norman tries to become a snail and a bird by tying different objects to him. Today I would you to change the ending of the story, instead of becoming a bird, what else could he try to be? Maybe a butterfly, or a spider by adding lots of legs. Maybe he would like to be fish and wear snorkel so he could swim. Can you draw me a picture of Norman being the animal you think he would like to be, or you could make him from playdough?

Daily Challenges:

- Can you race somebody in your family but try and go as slowly as a snail? How might snails move?


Make your name using letters.
