Today is: Monday 30th March

Today's tasks are (please see the timetable sent out previously for a recommended structure of the day however this is not a structure you need to follow for nursery but just guidance):

Pencil Control/Fine Motor Skills: Today is all about gross motor skills – check in with Joe Wicks and complete his daily workout to help build our core strength!

Maths/Literacy: Today I want you to think about ordering numbers. Start by watching the numberblocks episode — 'Off We Go' - https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08cr0y7/numberblocks-series-1-off-we-go. Discuss what happens in the episode. Who had to come first? How did they know which order to go in? Have a look at the slides at the end of this letter, can you point to which number should come first? Can you order the numbers by pointing to them in order? Can you spot my mistake — which numbers have I got mixed up?

Phonics: Today's phonics is a phase 1 activity looking at environmental sounds. If you can, go for a sound walk if not stand in your garden or even in your house with the window open. Stay really quiet and listen to the sounds around you. What can you hear? Can you name what is making the sound? Listening now in my flat I can hear: the wind, a car, a siren and someone talking. Maybe you could draw a picture of the things you hear.

Topic: This week we will be celebrating Easter. 
Daily Challenges:




- One Little Project is an amazing website full of craft ideas you can do at home. Check out all of these








LC: I can listen to a story and recall what happens
