Today is: Thursday 2nd April

Today's tasks are (please see the timetable sent out previously for a recommended structure of the day however this is not a structure you need to follow for nursery but just guidance):

Pencil Control/Fine Motor Skills: Today I want you to practise your pencil control by designing an Easter egg. What patterns might be on it? – Stripes, spots, zig-zags? What colours might you use? Ask your grown-up to draw and egg shapes for you to design on.

Maths/Literacy: Today I would like you to make an Easter card. What might you put on the front of it? Who might you give it to? Ask a grown-up to help you write in the card – what will you ask them to write? Can you try and write your name? Here are some examples of what you could do:



Phonics: Today I have uploaded a video all about blending. This is how we learn to read. Some children will be ready to access blending but don't worry if they don't get the hang of it straight away – they don't need to be blending until reception but it is always good to expose them to the concept. Practise at home by sounding out words to see if your child can hear what the word is, for example "put on your c-oa-t" or "please s-i-t at the table". Any questions please do email me.
