Today is: Thursday 26th March

Today's tasks are (please see the timetable sent out previously for a recommended structure of the day however this is not a structure you need to follow for nursery but just guidance):

Pencil Control/Fine Motor Skills: Pegging is a great way to strengthen our hands. You could help your grown-ups hang out some washing or play a game by pegging to right amount on a numbered cup. Can you race against your grown-up or sibling? Who can peg the most in 10 seconds?



Maths/Literacy: Today I want you to create a 'what to do in an emergency' poster for your home. What will it need to include? Maybe the number you ring in an emergency – 999. Maybe a drawing of the services you could ask for – fire, police and ambulance. Maybe you could even think about the information you may have to give them – where you live, who you live with? Phonics: Today's phonics is a phase 1 activity about hearing initial sounds and alliteration. Ask your grown-up to read this story. Can you hear a lot of words that start with the same sound? When you have words that start with the same sound it is called alliteration. See if you can spot the sound and then all the words that start with that sound.

On Monday, Oscar the Otter sat waiting for a friend. Whilst sitting he ate an orange, it was very juicy. Soon, Oliver the Octopus came past. Oliver couldn't stay and play though, he was going to the hospital for an operation. Next came Ollie the ostrich. Oscar saw an opportunity

to make a friend. 'Hello' Oscar said. 'Hello' said Ollie. 'Shall we play on the swings or the slide?' Oscar asked. 'I like the swings' Ollie said. The otter and the ostrich played together and Oscar shared his orange.

Topic: Can you create a picture of fire? What might you use? – Paint, chalk on the patio, coloured paper, felt tip pens. What colours would you use for a fire?

Daily Challenges:

- Forest school daily challenge brought to you by Mrs Nicholas Can you find a stick in your garden/just outside the front door and make it into your very own stick man? Or can you draw a stick man? What might you use/draw? What does he look like?
- Make up a story whilst playing with some of your toys maybe a train track: where are they going? Or a tea party with your teddies or even a paw patrol mission: what has happened? How will the pups help?
- Can you find any objects around your house that all start with the same sound?
