Today is: Wednesday 4th June

Today's tasks are (please not these activities can be done in any order and any preference. You do not need to complete them all but I have highlighted in yellow the activity that I feel is most beneficial.)

Pencil Control/Fine Motor Skills: We will be recapping some of the activities we have already done for fine motor skills over the next few weeks, with a few new activities popping up! Today's activity is using pegs!

Pegging is a great way to strengthen our hands. You could help your grown-ups hang out some washing or play a game by pegging the right amount on a numbered cup. Can you race against your grown-up or sibling? Who can peg the most in 10 seconds?



Maths/Literacy: Today we will be looking at counting pirate coins again, does anybody know what we call pirate coins? This time you need to count out the right amount for each of the numbered treasure chest. Use items at home that could be pirate coins, maybe some pennies or Lego pieces and count out the right amount for each treasure chest at the end of this letter.

Phonics: Today we are going to practise our blending skills. First, watch the video here:

How to conduct a... Pirate Density Investigation



You will need:



an empty
bottle or jar



water



oil



pirate objects
to test



Method:

1. Half fill your container with water, then add some oil.
2. Carefully drop your objects into the jar, what happens?

Can you mimic the motion of the waves? What happens if you mix the oil and water?

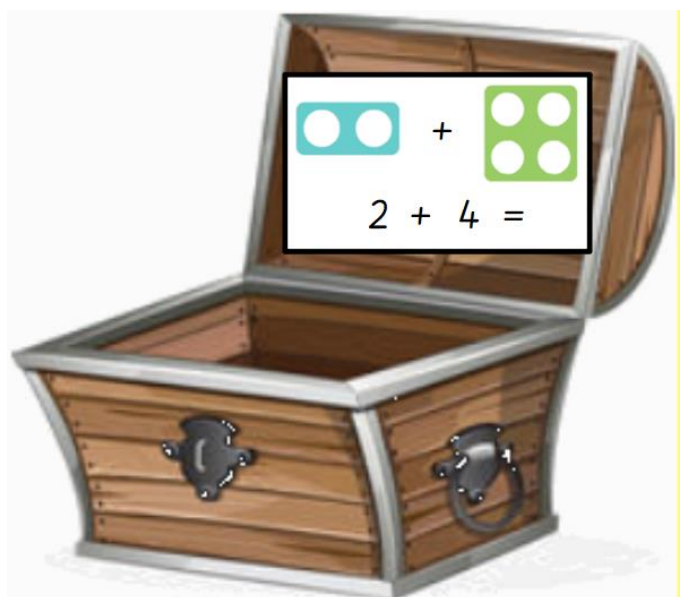


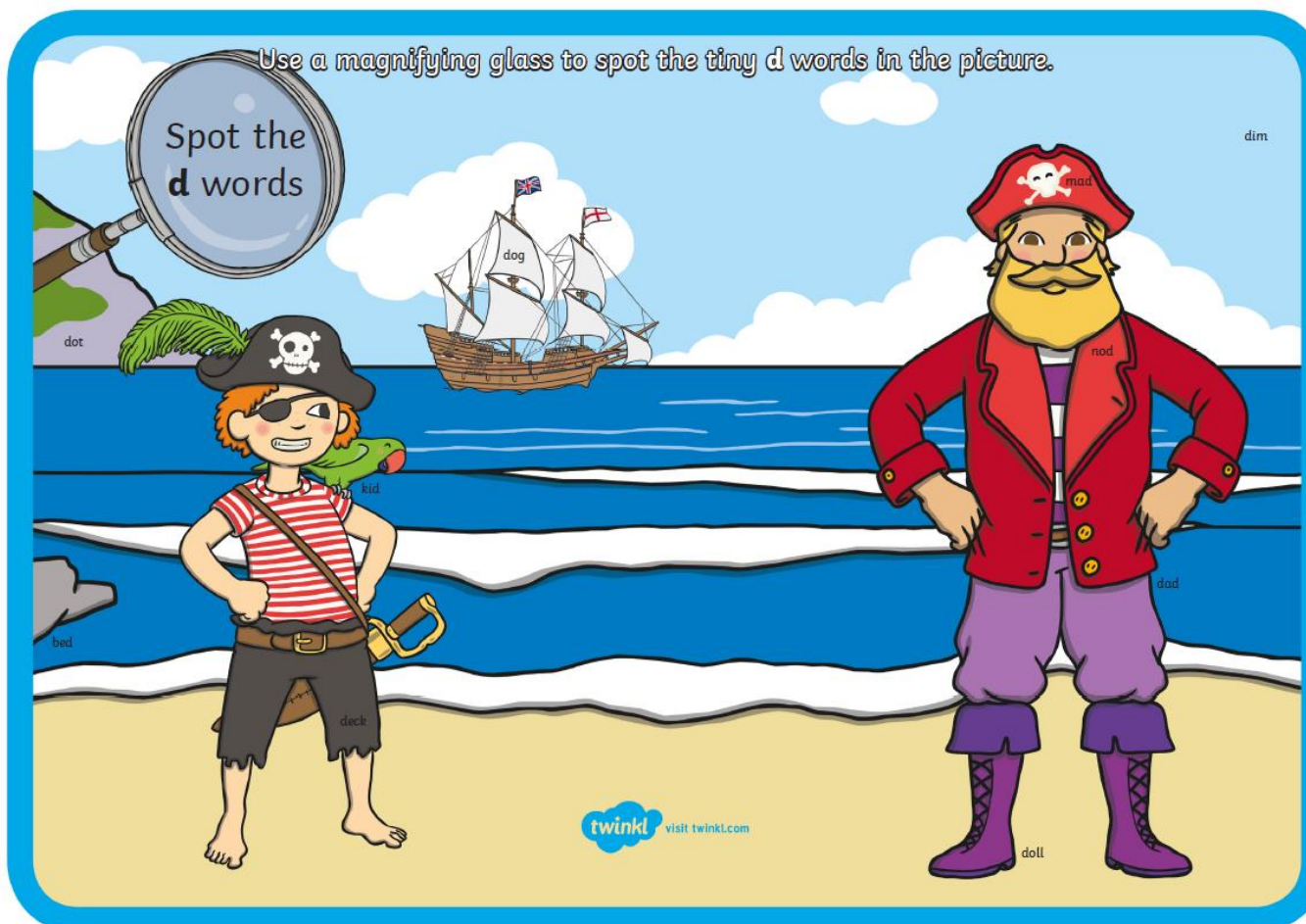
