Today is: Tuesday 28th April

Today's tasks are (please see the timetable sent out previously for a recommended structure of the day however this is not a structure you need to follow for nursery but just guidance):

Pencil Control/Fine Motor Skills: Today I want you to practise your scissor work but using scissors to cut up playdoh. How many pieces have you got? Can you cut big pieces and small pieces? Can you make small snips in the playdoh?

Maths/Literacy: Today I would like you to create a wanted poster for those 2 naughty robbers in our story. If we wanted people to find them what might we need to include? How will they know who to look for? Have a look at the template for the poster at the end of the letter to help you.


Grown-ups: you can encourage your child to 'write' their own sentences which may just be marks, they can then tell you what it says.




How Many Spots?


