Today's tasks are (please see the timetable sent out previously for a recommended structure of the day however this is not a structure you need to follow for nursery but just guidance):

Pencil Control/Fine Motor Skills: Practise your cutting and drawing skills by creating these fine motor skill people!



Maths/Literacy: Today's challenge is to practise writing the sounds we have learnt. If this is a little tricky practise drawing circles, lines and strokes like zig zags and spirals. The letters we know are:

m, a, s, d, t, i, p, n, g, o Check out this website to help show how to write the letters

Phonics: Today's phonics is learning a new sound – 'c'. Please check out the video on the website for the teaching of this lesson.

Topic: Think back to yesterday's story – 'Saving Easter'. Have a look at the picture from the story (at the end of the letter). Can you talk about what is happening in the picture? Can you think of a sentence for the picture?

Daily Challenges:

- Rescue the toys that have been frozen by Elsa! What could you use to save them? Salt? Warm water? What happens to the ice? Can you smash them free? What might you use to break the ice?
- Make some fingerprint counting flowers. Draw the centre of the flower and put a number in the middle, can you add that many fingerprint petals to it? - Can you draw some shadows of your toys? What will we need to create a shadow? – Light! We could use the sun or a light inside. What toy might you draw?
